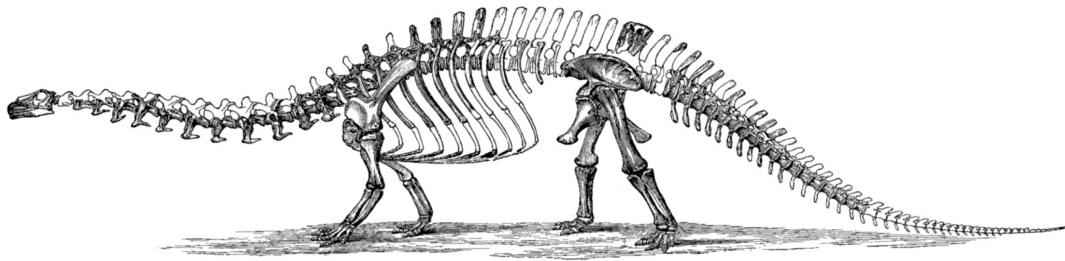

Visit the Community Library of the Shenango Valley's Educational Resource Center! This new collection provides over 2,000 educational support materials for homeschoolers, cyber schoolers, teachers, and families wishing to supplement their children's learning.

StoryWalks

Did you know that the Community Library has TWO StoryWalks in the community?

We have a StoryWalk at Rodney White Olympic Park Trails in Hermitage. And the other is at the Whispering Pines Park Trail in Hermitage.

A StoryWalk is a deconstructed children's book displayed in a weather-safe way along a popular walking path/trail.

Some benefits of a StoryWalk are:

- exposure to quality books for children
- greater family involvement in early literacy skills
- encourages learning in a natural setting
- boosts physical activity
- increased use of public spaces
